MISSION STATEMENT

Mothers and Others promotes social, service and religious opportunities to Christian mothers, their families, and other community members. We provide support to each other and the community through monthly meetings with educational speakers, service opportunities and social outings.

BY-LAWS

PURPOSE

We, the members of Mothers and Others, will endeavor to meet the needs of the membership through Christian Fellowship with other mothers. This group is organized to provide an informative and social outlet for women. It gives us an opportunity for intellectual stimulation, moral support and the opportunity to reach out to our community and support those in need.

MEMBERSHIP

Mothers and Others is a Christian organization open to all women in the community. Members from all religions are welcome and do not have to be a member of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Church to participate.

Payment of dues is required to maintain membership in Mothers and Others, except where variances are granted for cases of financial hardship.

Only paid members, according to the roll of the Treasurer, are eligible to vote or nominate candidates for all offices.

Only paid members will have active enrollment in yahoo group email and be granted access to “members only” area of setonmothersandothers.org.

DUES

Annual dues are payable upon joining and are renewed thereafter at the first meeting in September. Dues help to defer the costs of baby-sitters for meetings, supplies, social functions, and play day purchases. The amount will be determined by a majority vote of the Board members present at the May Board meeting for the following September. Dues amount will roll over from year to year unless voted on to change at a meeting.

Returning members who have not paid dues for the current year by the third Monday in October will be ineligible to vote or nominate, and will be removed from the membership directory, group email and members only area of the website until such time as the dues are paid.

Dues for persons requesting new membership during the course of the year will be on a prorated basis. For members joining in August through December, the full annual amount will be due. A reduced rate of approximately three-fifths (3/5) will be due for members joining in January through May. Exact amounts will be decided upon at the May Board meeting. Renewal membership dues will be at the current annual amount unless changed by a majority vote of the Board in May.

TERM OF OFFICE

A Board member is either an Officer, Committee Chair or committee member as defined by the Board Position & Responsibilities document. A term of office shall be from June 1 through May 31. Nominations will be held at the April meeting for any open positions.

A Board position is considered “open” if the previous participant declines to serve a second year, has already served two years in that position, or if that member is open to having a new person fill that role.

If only one person is nominated for an open position by the May meeting, that person will fill the vacancy. If two or more individuals are nominated for the same position, then a blind vote of the membership will be taken at the May meeting. Members may serve in multiple positions. The President, in conjunction with the Vice President, has the right to fill any vacant positions as necessary.

The President from the preceding year will be a Board member for one year following her term of office. She shall have the option as serving in a purely advisory capacity with voting rights or filling a vacant Board position.

Members may not serve more than two consecutive years in the same office, nor can they remain on the Board in any position for more than four consecutive years, with the exception of the President when serving in her fourth consecutive year. This President would then serve a 5th consecutive year on the Board as outlined above.

MEETINGS

Mothers and Others shall meet on the morning of the second Tuesday of each month. This day and time may change to meet the needs of the members or to accommodate specific programs.

We will hold our meetings in the activity building. Under normal circumstances, baby-sitting will be available from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.

The Board meets and sets up on the Monday evening prior to the Tuesday meeting. Board meetings are REQUIRED for Officers and Committee Chairs and optional for committee members. Board meetings are open to any interested member of Mothers and Others, although only Officers, Committee Chairs and committee members can vote.

Except where otherwise stated, a quorum consisting of at least one-fourth (1/4) of the Board members must be present at a meeting for business to be legally transacted.

Motions properly presented and seconded will require approval by a majority of votes cast by Board members, with the exception of amendments to these Bylaws which will require a quorum consisting of at least one-fourth (1/4) of the membership and a majority of votes of the membership for approval.

Baby-sitting is available during meetings for the children of Mothers and Others so that members can relax and enjoy the meetings. Mothers and Others adheres to St. Elizabeth Ann Seton's Safe Environment Program, which requires all sitters to have their backgrounds checked and attend an annual seminar on safety before working with children.

Mothers are welcome to bring their infants to the meetings if they are younger than 6 months. However, with discretion, we ask that children over 6 months of age be placed in the babysitting rooms so all of our members can enjoy the meetings without disruption. If you have a concern or question, please feel free to contact Michelle Solis.

Babysitters are not responsible for administering medication to the children. Any other special instructions can be left with the babysitters in the child's room.

All children are required to have their own necessities (diapers, bottles, change of clothes, etc.) in a bag with their name on it. **PLEASE LABEL ALL** contents clearly.

The fees are: Check in at the door= \$10 per child
Prepay by Friday before the meeting= \$6 per child
Annual/Semester prepayment= \$6 1st child/\$4 2nd child/\$3 per child after that

Members are encouraged to prepay by either mailing in payment or using our new online payment system at www.setonmothersandothers.org/payments.shtml . Prepayment provides automatic reservations and, if prepaid by the September meeting, then the month of September is free. Children may be dropped off for babysitting after 9:15 a.m. and must be picked up no later than 12:00 p.m.

Babysitting fees are non-refundable.

Our babysitters use time-outs as a method of helping to deal with disruptive behavior.

BABY-SITTING SUBSTITUTES: When we cannot get enough sitters for our meetings, it's nice to have members who will forego the meeting to watch some of the children. You will be paid \$30 for your efforts. You must be cleared through St. Elizabeth Ann Seton's **Safe Environment Program** and attend an annual 40-minute seminar or complete an online refresher course on safety in order to offer your services. Jasmine McCormick can help walk you through the Safe Environment Program requirements.

KIDS' PLAY DAY

Kids' Play Days (KPD) were designed to give Moms a break. These are held once a month on a prescheduled Friday from 9:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m. in the church's nursery (unless otherwise noted). It is a FLAT FEE for the ENTIRE 4 hours. The cost is \$8.00 per child for Members and \$12.00 per child for Non-Members. You are able to pay this fee online at

www.setonmothersandothers.org/payments.shtml. **Please see the website for complete cancellation policies.** Several months will be available for sign-up at one time and your reservation will be held once payment is received. If you would like to sign-up for a play day and have missed the meeting, contact Joanna Childers, the Babysitting Reservations Coordinator, or sign up on the website. All play days must be prepaid to make drop off time run smoothly. All that is required at drop off is a backpack/diaper bag with your child's name, any snacks and drinks they may need (we do extend over lunchtime so please take that into consideration), name tag on your child and bag, and phone number of where you can be reached during those 4 hours.

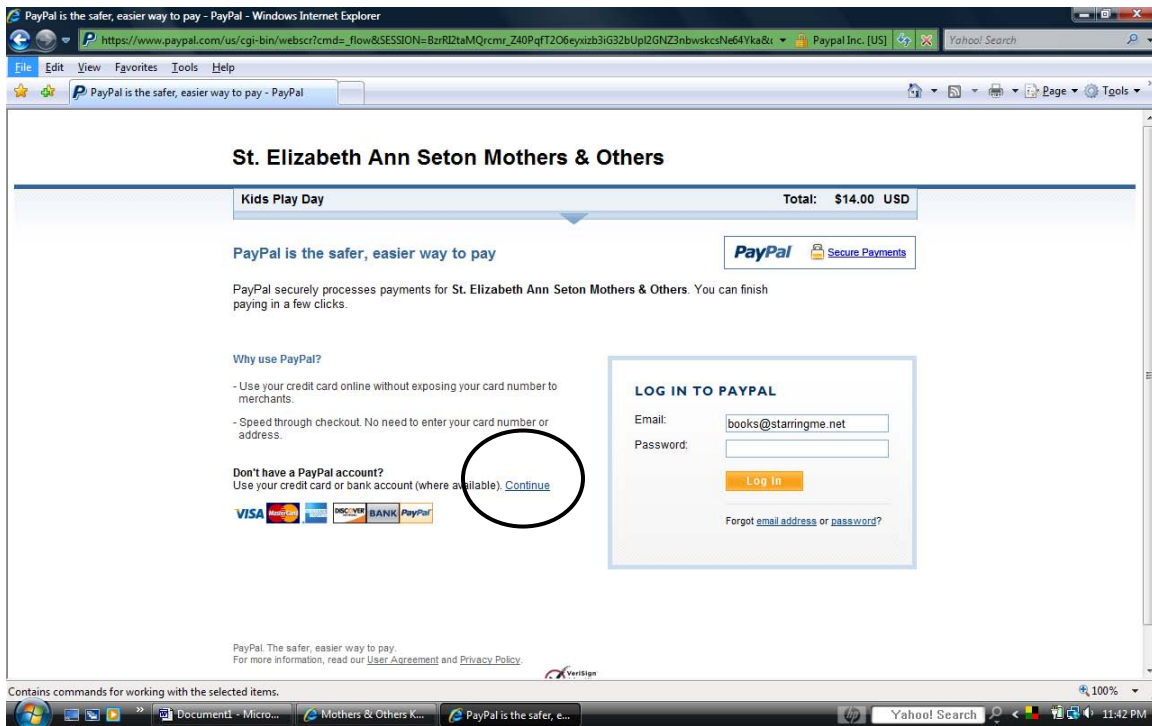

*******HELPFUL INFO FOR WORKING ONLINE*******

MAKING PAYMENTS ONLINE

To pay for activities, registration, or babysitting online, our site utilizes PayPal to process those payments. You do **NOT** need to have an account with PayPal to pay for your activities on our site. We simply use PayPal as a clearinghouse. If you choose not to create an account, none of your information is saved and all information is passed through to PayPal using a secured, encrypted page.

Once you click on “Add to Cart” and proceed to checkout, you will get the following screen.

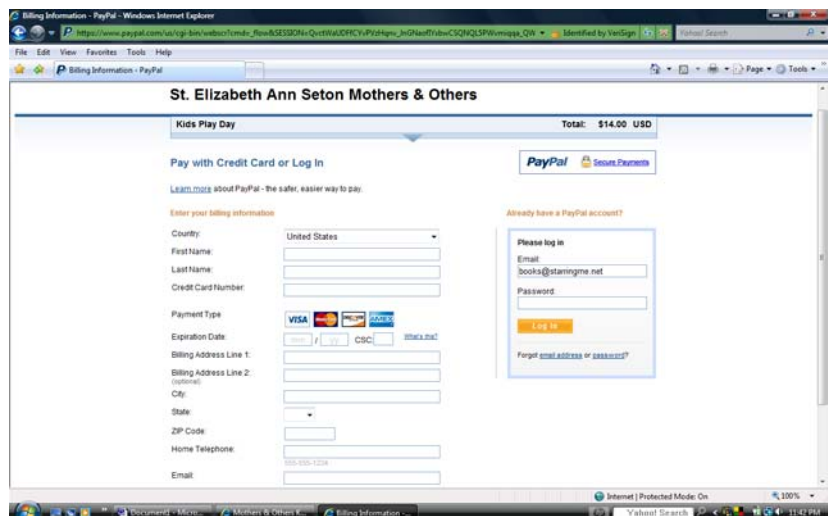


If you wish to use PayPal, you can use the Log In window on the right. You can choose to pay with money you have in your PayPal account, in your own personal checking account or even with the credit card you have on file. It just depends on how your PayPal account is set up.

However, you **do not need** to use your PayPal account even if you have one, and you certainly do not need to create one. You can go down to the statement “**Don’t have a PayPal account?**” and click on the **Continue** link at the end of the statement “Use your credit card or bank account (where available)” (circled in picture above).

Once you do, this window comes up.

You enter your information here, securely. You can tell it’s secure because of “s” at the end of http://, which indicates a secured site in a URL. After you are finished, it will



ask you if you wish to save your information and create a PayPal account. Simply say “No”. That’s all there is to it. Your information is not saved and you haven’t created an account.

“Using PayPal” can mean two things; 1) making a payment using a PayPal account or 2) using PayPal to process online monetary transactions. Our site uses it like number 2 and never requires number 1. It’s safe and simple to use.

EVITE

Mothers and Others utilizes <http://www.evite.com> for many of our functions, meetings and outings. It’s an easy way to share information about an activity and to find out who else is planning to attend. As a member you will receive an email with the subject line “XYZ has sent you an Evite Invitation.” Usually these will come from our Outings Coordinator for outings and from our Vice President for monthly meetings, but you may also see them from other Board members for special events that we host throughout the year and for Bunco. Once you open the email you have the option to view the invitation. Click on that link and it will take you directly to evite.com. Here you will see basic information about the event and have a chance to reply.

Under the “**Reply Here**” section you can say yes, no or maybe, add a comment and for our meetings, you can also choose from a drop down list for something to bring. We rely on all our members to volunteer to bring items off this list throughout the year.

To check to see if a food item is still needed, go to “**Guest Options**” on the far left side of your screen and click on the “**View Guests’ Responses.**” This brings up a list of who is bringing what. You do not need to write in your specific items in your **Reply Here Comment Box**, just use the drop down menu and everyone can check for still needed items by going to **View Guests’ Responses.**

Using Evite really helps us plan for our events – gives us head counts (Under Reply Here there is a place to indicate how many people you are bringing), food counts, etc. Please take the time to reply to your Evites and to update them if things change. We all use this tool to find out who is going to be where, making it easier to find each other at an outing.

Of course you can also delete the emails that come in from Evite if you wish. Just remember that if you delete them without viewing them, you might miss out on some really fun events! You also will not be counted in the headcount if an activity requires specific numbers, and sometimes that means an event will be cancelled.

Once you have created an account, you can go to [Evite.com](http://evite.com) at any time and see a list of all your events along with how you responded at a glance. Once you log in, it will become your main page for evite.com. Some people even make evite.com their homepage when they bring up the internet so they can stay on top of things!
